Main findings

Population statistics are impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and the resulting Australian Government closure of the international border from March 2020.

The ABS is assessing the impact of changed traveller behaviour on overseas migration estimates, which is likely to result in more frequent revisions to preliminary overseas migration estimates to reflect the most timely data available.

- Queensland's preliminary ERP at 31 December 2023
 was 5,528,292 persons (20.5% of the Australian
 population). This reflects an increase of 141,378 persons
 over the 12 months, and 30,195 persons since 30
 September 2023 (Figure 1).




Figure 2 Population growth rate, Australia and states and territories, year ending 31 December 2023

- Queensland recorded a population growth rate of 2.6% in the 12 months to 31 December 2023, above the national average (2.5%) and below Western Australia (3.3%) and Victoria (2.8%) (Figure 2).
- Net overseas migration made the largest contribution to population growth in Queensland in the 12 months to 31 December 2023 (62.2%) followed by net interstate migration (22.3%) and natural increase (15.5%) (Table 1).
- In the 12 months to 31 December 2023, natural increase (births minus deaths) was 21,845 persons, a decrease from the 23,010 persons recorded during the 12 months to 30 September 2023.
- The COVID-19 pandemic and the resulting closure of the international borders have impacted net overseas migration. Net overseas migration for December quarter 2023 contributed 16,539 persons to Queensland's population, compared with a contribution of 19,128 persons in December quarter 2022.
- Net interstate migration contributed 31,595 persons to population change in Queensland over the 12 months to 31 December 2023, a decrease from the 32,625 persons recorded during the 12 months to 30 September 2023.

Figure 1 Annual population increase by components of population change, Queensland
