


Figure 1 Annual change in employment, Toowoomba SA4





Figure 2 Unemployment rate by SA4, September 2024

Main findings

Note: Due to the high standard errors associated with regional labour force direct survey estimates, the ABS and QGSO recommend using 12-month averages to reduce the volatility of the underlying original data.

All data in this brief are based on 12-month moving averages of direct survey estimates.

- The number of employed persons in Toowoomba SA4 in September 2024 was 86,800 persons, an increase of 9,700 employed persons, or 12.6% over the year (Figure 1).
- The unemployment rate in Toowoomba SA4 in September 2024 was 3.8 per cent, a decrease of 0.7 percentage point over the year. The unemployment rate for this area was the ninth-lowest of all 19 SA4s within Queensland (Figure 2).
- The participation rate in Toowoomba SA4 in September 2024 was 64.5 per cent, an increase of 5.4 percentage points over the year (Table 1).
