


Figure 1 Annual change in employment, Townsville SA4





Figure 2 Unemployment rate by SA4, September 2024

Main findings

Note: Due to the high standard errors associated with regional labour force direct survey estimates, the ABS and QGSO recommend using 12-month averages to reduce the volatility of the underlying original data.

All data in this brief are based on 12-month moving averages of direct survey estimates.

- The number of employed persons in Townsville SA4 in September 2024 was 122,900 persons, a decrease of 10,600 employed persons, or 7.9% over the year (Figure 1).
- The unemployment rate in Townsville SA4 in September 2024 was 4.4 per cent, an increase of 1.7 percentage points over the year. The unemployment rate for this area was the seventh-highest of all 19 SA4s within Queensland (Figure 2).
- The participation rate in Townsville SA4 in September 2024 was 65.5 per cent, a decrease of 5.8 percentage points over the year (Table 1).
