

Main findings

- Brisbane's headline consumer price index (CPI) increased 1.0% in June quarter 2024, resulting in a 3.4% increase over the year. In annual terms, Brisbane recorded the fifth-largest increase while Perth recorded the largest increase for all capital cities in Australia (see Table 1).
- Compared with the weighted average of eight capital cities for June quarter 2024, Brisbane recorded stronger contributions from the CPI groups of Recreation and culture, Insurance and financial services, Alcohol and tobacco, Clothing and footwear and Health. These were partly offset by detractions from the Communication and Education groups (see Figure 1).
- For Brisbane, the *Housing* group made the largest contribution to inflation in June quarter 2024 (0.19 of a percentage point). Within the *Housing* group, *Rents* increased 2.1% in the quarter.
- For Brisbane, the Communication group recorded the largest detraction from inflation in June quarter 2024 (0.02 of a percentage point). Within the Communication group, Postal services decreased 1.3% in the quarter.




Figure 2 CPI annual change, Australia

- Australia's CPI for market sector goods and services, which excludes more volatile items, increased 0.9% in June quarter 2024, with an annual inflation rate of 3.4% (see Figure 2).

Figure 1 Quarterly CPI contributions, by group, June quarter 2024
